1. **GIVE THE** king your justice, O God,\*  
and your righteousness to the king' s son;
2. That he may rule your people right-eous^ly \*

3. That the mountains may bring prosperity to the peo-ple,\*  
and the little hills bring right-eous^ness.
4. He shall defend the needy among the peo-ple; \*  
he shall rescue the poor and crush the oppressor.
5. He shall live as long as the sun and moon endure,\*  
from one generation to another.
6. He shall come down like rain upon the mown field,\*  
like showers that wa-ter the earth.
