1. **I WAITED** patiently u-pon the Lord;\*  
he stooped to me and heärd my<sup>^</sup>cry.
2. He lifted me out of the desolate pit, out of the mire and clay;\*  
he set my feet upon a high cliff and made my föot-ing<sup>^</sup>sure.
3. He put a new song in my mouth,  
a song of praise to our God;\*  
many shall see, and stand in awe,  
and put their trust in the<sup>^</sup>Lord.
4. Happy are they who trust in the Lord!\*  
they do not resort to evil spirits or turn to fälse gods.
5. Great things are they that you have done, O Lord my God!  
how great your wonders and your plans for<sup>^</sup>us!\*
6. Oh, that I could make them known and tell them!\*  
but they are more than I can<sup>^</sup>count.
7. In sacrifice and offering you take no pleasure \*  
(you have given me ears to hëar you);
8. Burnt-offering and sin-offering you have not re<sup>^</sup>quired,\*  
and so I said, "Be-höld I<sup>^</sup>come.
9. In the roll of the book it is writ-ten concerning<sup>^</sup>me:\*  
' I love to do your will, O my God  
your law is deep in my<sup>^</sup>heart.' "
10. I proclaimed righteousness in the great con-gregation;\*  
behold, I did not restrain my lips;  
and that, O Lörd, you<sup>^</sup>know.
11. Your righteousness have I not hidden in my heart;  
I have spoken of your faithfulness and your delive<sup>^</sup>rance;\*  
I have not concealed your love and faithfulness  
from the great congre-gä-tion.  
Alleluia! ALLELUIA!
12. You are the Lord;  
do not withhold your com-pas-sion from me;\*  
let your love and your faithfulness keep me safe for ëv-er.  
ALLELUIA!

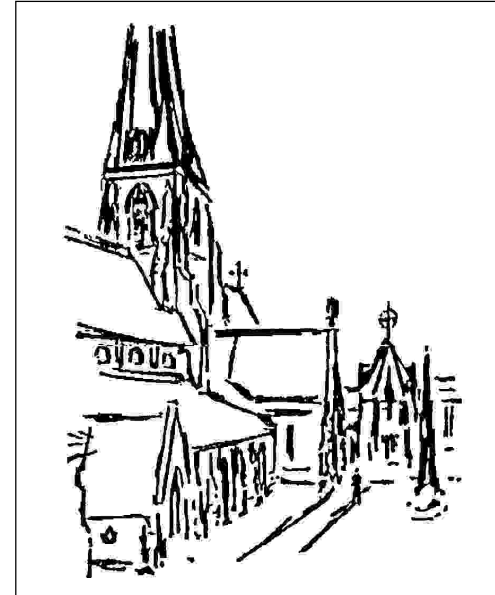
**Ave Maria:** Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. (after Luke 2)

**Ave verum corpus:** Hail true body, you who hung on the cross for the sake of humanity, from whose side flowed both water and blood. Be our food both now and at our death. O sweet, O holy Jesus, son of Mary, have mercy on us. (Innocent VI)
